Dodge Dart – Then and Now

A couple years ago Gary (and I) wrote about our 1972 Dart Swinger, named Ruby. While the new Dart doesn't resemble the old, as much as, say the Chargers or Challengers, it does look good sitting next to its older sister.

Have you been to the compact car party recently? If so, you've noticed Chrysler hasn't been in attendance. It's been years since Chrysler has had a compact. To be exact, it has been seven years. During those years, other manufacturers have been producing sleek and fuel-efficient models. It's time for Chrysler to crash the party. They aren't going stag though. They've brought a date... a little Italian.

Introducing the Dodge Dart: American History, European Success

Many thought this compact-sedan would be called the Hornet, from the Geneva show concept. The folks at Dodge decided to tie in a little history and keep it in the family. In the 60s, the Dart started a compact revolution within the Chrysler family. From 1960 to 1976, after only sixteen years of production more than 3.7 million Darts were sold.

Beneath the Dart's curvaceous body panels and trademark design cues of current Dodge products is an assemblage of parts sourced from Fiat. The Dart shares its chassis, suspension, an engine and a transmission with Fiat entity, the Alfa Romeo.

The 2013 Dart, assembled in Illinois, kicks things off with one of the most powerful base-engines in the segment, the Tigershark. It draws 160 horsepower and 148 pound-feet of torque out of a 2.0-liter four-cylinder. Buyers can pair it with the six-speed manual transmission that comes standard, or spend a little more for a sixspeed automatic. Dodge has a 1.4-liter, turbocharged four-cylinder engine that comes from the Fiat 500 Abarth. The horsepower is the same as the Dart's base engine at 160, but torque jumps to 184 pound-feet. Rated at 25 miles per gallon in the city and up to 41 mpg on the highway, this Dodge will get you down Route 66 with fewer stops than before.

While the Dart's DNA is Italian with many mechanical components provided by Fiat, its front is aggressive and bold. Inside, the Dart is upscale for an American-made compact with its savvy fashion-forward design and precision craftsmanship. From behind, you'll see its glowing race track LED tail lamps and flying

buttress, inspired from second generation Chargers of the past. And with more than 100,000 customizable options, there's a combination for everyone.

Technology: Then and Now

During the 60s and 70s, radio, A/C and power windows were considered state of the art technology. Now, you get an 8.4" touch screen, backup camera, and rain-sensitive windshield wipers. You can even unlock and start the Dart with a custom iPhone app.

The new Dart comes equipped with 10 airbags, wreck this and you'll be bouncing around on a cloud of marshmallows. We all know the old Darts don't have airbags, we just hold on when the ride gets rough.

Blind spot monitoring and rear cross-path detection monitors rear blind zones on either side of the vehicle via radar and will notify the driver when something is detected. We have that on Ruby... it's called a love tap.

On a side note, I was a bit disappointed when Dodge ruined the new, amazing Dart commercial with a cameo of Tom Brady. GO COLTS!

Oh, you want to take a test drive? I might know someone that can help.

From Ken Scobel: I need your prayers. I have been diagnosed as having advanced prostate cancer. Back in June I had a blood test taken and my PSA level was 23. Normal is 0-4. This resulted in a biopsy a couple weeks ago and the results came back positive. About 12 tissue samples were taken and all showed evidence of cancer. This is an aggressive cancer and how far it has spread is unknown at the present time. I am scheduled for a bone scan next week along with additional tests to determine how far it has spread. Treatment being discussed includes hormone and radiation. Horome is the injection of a drug twice a year to reduce the amount of testosterone in the body. This is the primary cause of growth of the cancer cells. Reduction of testosterone will result in a reduction of active cancer cells. Radiation would kill the rest. Hopefully this treatment will be successful. This has become a very stressful time, worrying about what the future holds. I appreciate your prayers and support! Ken


