Upon inquiring about the car I found that it was a repossession. This car was destined to be mine! Believe it or not this car was to become our daily family go getter, a race car and a show car. We had many years of great times with her (the car), an awesome automobile with "throw you back in your seat power" whenever you asked her for a little excitement. Many wins and much attention were showered on her where ever she was seen. Great car!

Then came the day when it was time to sell all the toys, (cars, boats, and golf clubs). Time to be that responsible father and husband, raise a family, put food on the table, clothes on the kids, a roof on the house, and see that the kids enjoyed their pursuits of school, sports, and friends.

Fast forward to 2005: All of the are kids married off and starting their families and mom is content with life. I start browsing the internet, eBay and the like, just to see what that thing is out there that is exciting everyone about owning Classic Muscle Cars and seems to be sweeping the nation, (Barrett Jackson and all). Looking at all the pictures and reading about the cars on the internet is like going to car shows. Fascinating! Then there it was, a 1966 Plymouth Satellite that looked just exactly like my old Hemi car. Only one thing missing...no Hemi! But, it was a 318 Poly. Still, it was memory restorer and the juices starting flowing. I had to go see this car. The location was just outside of Murfreesboro, Tennessee. I conferred with the wife and convinced her that I was not totally crazy. She relented to traveling with me to go see this car.

So we hopped in the ever reliable Caravan and set out on our little day trip. That is right, no truck and trailer to bring back this beauty in case I was obsessed with this prize? It was a beautiful, warm early Spring day. Just right for a little jaunt of roughly 320 miles, (one way), just a quick little trip on a nice day.

I looked over and under the car (the best I could). The car drove out really well. It was not cherry by all means, but I convinced myself that "it

Next, I introduce myself to this car and we have a quick discussion about her future if she will just get me home today. OK, intro is over and I fire the big old Poly up and she roars to life (or something like that). First thing is to top off the tank with gas. Humm, gas needle still reads not full. Oh well I know that it is full so here we go!

About 20 miles down the road she is running fine and the engine is purring along but I have noticed that it has a gear in it that is not stock but not too radical. The speedometer seems right but we are not pushing it and 50 to 55 MPH seems safe. Even though Nickee is behind me in the van we don't want to break anything now, out here on the interstate in the middle of nowhere. So we will just cruise home a little slower than usual. We will just have to be patient. A little further down the road I notice that clouds are starting to roll in and looks like we are going to get some rain soon. Still trucking along and wanting to get a little something to eat we stop at a station for some snacks to carry along just in case we might need them out on the road. I also notice that the gas gauge is dropping a little more than I thought it should so I top off the tank again. Maybe it is the gear/RPM? We have reached the Tennessee/Kentucky border.

Back on the road with my trusty service vehicle following me, it starts to rain. So I turn on my wipers. They seem work well for 40+ year old devices but I wonder if the blades are original as I can't see anything through the blur. Surely it will soon clear up a little. Maybe some film on the window? I stop and pour a little Coke on the window and this helps some. Besides at this speed who needs wipers anyway? I can't help but feel that the weather is starting to cool off and I am starting to get a little chilly. I didn't bring a jacket. This concerns me as there are several parts for the heater sitting on the seat next to me. Humm, this could be interesting. I flick a couple of switches and push some buttons. Yes! The heater fan works but I can't get heat. The vacuum controlled switch doesn't seem to be working and I'm still getting cold outside air through the vents. No air is flowing to the right places. Still trudging down the road at breakneck speeds of 58 mph I notice with the outside temperature getting colder and the rain still falling. The windows are starting to fog over. Great! No heat, no defroster! I can keep some small spots in front of me cleaned off with the paper napkins I got from the snack bar. I pick it up to 60 mph.

About midway into Kentucky we stop again. I get items to replace the shredded napkins to better clean off the windows, particularly the inside frost. Still concerned with fuel usage I top off the gas tank again. I'm starting to really feel the cold!

When we hit the Kentucky/Indiana border, half frozen, I get my first real sense that I may actually make it home tonight (alive) after all. Still a considerable distance from home the old Poly engine is performing flawlessly and I think to myself "patience my butt!" I step it up to 65 mph. She is starting to whine now but sounds solid. It stopped raining sometime in Kentucky but it is now starting to sleet.

Whose idea was it to drive this gal home from over 300 miles away? I have had plenty of time think, listen for every strange sound and tried to wonder of what I would do if she did break down in the middle of nowhere. I thought I was smarter than this. This endeavor could have put us all in jeopardy. Around Seymour I top off the tank again. I want to make sure that we don't run out of gas this close to home. Besides, I can't feel my fingertips!

I don't remember how many hours this venture took in total but it seemed like an eternity. When the lights of Greenwood came into view the pressure of all of us making it home in one piece had been lifted from me. When home I crawled out of the car, kissed the ground, patted her on the hood for a job well done and promised myself never again without a trailer. Hemi would have been proud of her!

Years later she has gone through many various restorations and made more roadworthy too. (One being a gas tank replacement for the original that had previously been caved in in the frontal area; who'd thunk it?). Though not perfect she is a great looker and a good driver. I am now toying with the crazy idea of building up a Poly with some pop. I have found an old Poly donor engine and the juices are starting to flow again. I'm always up for something unusual. Can't afford a Hemi so why not. We will just have wait and see. Maybe another article later?




