

Member Profile

Happy Winter everyone! My name is Lynn Standeford and this is my member profile for this month's newsletter.



This article is about how I started working on cars and my love of the Mopar. My growing up years were not the greatest. What got me through was working on our Dodges. I definitely learned patience, I gained selfconfidence and yes – it made me happy.

I was born and raised in Southern California and have been around Mopars all of my life. We had a 1967 Dodge A-100 van with a 225 slant 6 motor, a 1976 Dodge pickup truck with a 318 motor, and a 1962 Dodge pickup truck with a 413 motor. I guess I always loved cars as I was not into playing with Barbie Dolls and preferred to play with my three toy cars, a lime green Ford Maverick, a white Ford Maverick and a red and white cement truck. Yes, I guess I was weird as I hung out with the boys and played football and raced bicycles. To top it all off, I loved taking things apart. Anything with screws would be neatly disassembled and pieces handed to my mom. I loved helping my dad work on the car and was so excited when he promoted me to "Go-For" instead of being told not to touch anything.

I started working on our cars when I was nine years old. I was responsible for lubing the chassis, then worked my way up to oil and filter changes. When I was 13, I did my first major tune-up, changing the plugs, cap, points, rotor and condenser.

My very first car however, was not a Dodge but a 1957 Nash Metropolitan. I inherited this car from my grandfather and rebuilt the motor with the help of my dad. At the age of 15, I was a member of the Metropolitan Club in California and found out that I was the only Metropolitan in the group that had the "Nash" emblem in the grill instead of the familiar "M".



In 1985, I was a straight A student and in the honors program when I had to drop out of high school to support my mom and dad. I was devastated as I felt that my dreams went out the window. My mom and dad needed me and I did everything I could to help them.



After working a couple of months, I bought a 1969 Dodge A-100 van, it had a 318 motor, 727 Loadflight transmission and it had "Willamette's Gospel Singers" painted on the side. Little did I know this van would have such an influence on me. Yes, he had a name – his name was Tony.

I rebuilt the motor in 1992 literally under a shade tree by a dry river bed. I planned the rebuild for months and saved up for the parts. I rebuilt the motor myself and I felt so awesome that I actually did it. He sounded great!





In 1992, I got married to my ex-husband who was in the Army. We moved from Escondido, California to Fort Rucker, Alabama. In 1993, we moved to El Paso, Texas. Having two small children and moving around a lot being married to a military member, I had to make the decision to let my Tony go. I could not work on cars as I needed to focus on my kids. I also was having an issue with having a place to work on the cars.


I bought him in 1985 and sold him to a church mission group in El Paso, Texas in 1993. I was heartbroken when I had to let him go as he had been there by my side through all of the trials of my life. In a weird way, Tony was my best friend when I was growing up. After letting him go, I vowed that I would not work on cars again. I just didn't want to. Until 21 years later.......

She came to me when I was feeling my lowest and helped me get through a rough Christmas this last year. I was hoping to have Molly where she could actively participate in the club events this year but unfortunately life happened.
