About the time we became interested in cars (12-13 years old) my father sold it. The new buyers inflated the tires, fresh gasoline, a fresh battery, started it up and drove it home.

My twin was an employee at the Chrysler Electronics plant. His first new car was a 1965 Plymouth Satellite. It was a beautiful car.

My first Plymouth was a 1979 Valiant Brougham Station Wagon with a 318 V8 and A/C. This was followed by a 1987 Fifth Avenue. I also had a 1984 Dodge pickup, a 1987 Dodge pickup which I found at a dealer in Narrows, West Virginia (Big Red); followed by a 2002 Dodge Dakota Sport pickup; and a 1966 Plymouth II Satellite hardtop.

My latest acquisition is a 1964 Plymouth Sport Fury with a 440 which my brother found in a pole barn north of Cumberland, IN. I hope to have the rebuilt 440 engine (built by Steve Schmidt Racing) and a rebuilt 727 Transmission installed by late April or early May. Body work will be completed shortly after.

This has been a 7 year project with a very steep learning curve. I wish to thank those in the club who have helped me with suggestions and adjustments.

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An Oldie but Goodie Profile from the past – November 2008! My other Mopar Bob Rosenberger





Besides my 1970 Hemicuda clone, I have a numbers matching 1971 Dodge Challenger R/T. I had not owned a Mopar for twenty-six years prior to the purchase of this car. My last Mopar prior to this car was a 1970 Duster 340. With the gas crisis of the 70's and my own domestic priorities changing, I had made a conscious decision to give up on performance cars altogether.

Fast forward 20+ years. The desire to own an old muscle car started in 1994 while I was in Houston on business. I was on the interstate, going to my hotel, when I heard the unmistakable roar of a big-block, at speed, coming up behind me in the fast lane. I looked in the rearview mirror and there was the classic '69 Charger R/T coming toward me. It passed me on the left, probably going about 80+mph. It was a fully restored, B5-blue beauty. That got me to thinking about getting a project to restore an old Mopar.

After getting back home, I had decided to look for a 'Cuda to restore but was having difficulty getting a suitable car to work on. Most of the 'Cudas were already restored and their owners wanted a fortune for them or they were recently pulled out of a swamp and were missing most of their parts. I decided to purchase the Challenger because I was itching to have a muscle car and it was already restored - not to mention the fact I had been looking for a year and a half already. So now I could go to the cruises and shows while I was looking for my project car. The guy I bought it from was being cajoled into selling by his wife. They had just completed building a new house and the wife did not want "that old car" taking up space in the garage! He reluctantly put it up for sale. There was a buyer ahead of me but I had cash in my hand and that was all it took. Over the years, I would see the seller at various shows and swap meets and he would always ask me if I was interested in selling it back to him but I always said no.

Basically it's a numbers matching Challenger R/T. It is a "stripe-delete" R/T though. I guess the original owner did not want to call any excess attention to himself from the highway patrol, as the car is originally from California. It has a 383 cid engine, "slap-stick" automatic trans., a 3.55 ratio 8 3/4" rear, power steering & brakes, AM - FM original radio, and it has factory air-conditioning. It is a nice car to drive and it has ample reserve power when you need it. I don't drive it nearly as much as I used to once the 'Cuda was completed. My wife, Karen, likes to drive it.
