Indy Cylinder Head – Chrysler Performance Trade Show

This is the first show of the year where the Indy Mopar Club has a presence with our booth and display. Our club involvement began on Friday March 1 set-up.



A group of members set up the IMC booth display, moved three members cars into position and prepped for the show that opened at 9am Saturday morning March 2.

Many thanks to all that helped in set-up, assisted Indy Cylinder Head with manning the doors and pulled duty at the IMC booth over the two days.







Jeff & Deb Platzer's Dodge Magnum, Bob Thomas' Chrysler TC convertible and Ed Wagler's bronze '70 Plymouth 'Cuda represented the Club in fine fashion at the Show. The Trade Show which benefits the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation just as the IMC, was again very successful with a large variety of used parts, new parts suppliers along with Mopar cars & trucks for sale.

The IMC booth took JDRF donations, sold past Fletcher & Westgate event shirts, signed up new and renewed members and got the Club in front of the general Mopar public. The booth also provided a great hangout for members to socialize or just take a needed break from walking the Marsh Buildings at the Indiana State Fairgrounds.

On the 'Cars for Sale' scene, vehicles ran the gamut from a front wheel drive Daytona, a '65 Dodge Coronet HT, a '69 Dodge Charger to a fairly well preserved '68 Super Stock Hemi Barracuda (for only \$90k). A few members including Dave Watt & Mike Leyes had their own swap spot to sell parts, literature and die-cast models.





Two really cool Super Stock race cars from the past were on display this year. The Sox & Martin '67 RO Hemi Belvedere SS/D & Butch Leal's '65 Plymouth Belvedere SS/B cars were beautifully restored. As a teenager working at Indianapolis Raceway Park in the late 60s, I had the opportunity to see Ronnie Sox race the '67 Plymouth and a year later the '68 Super Stock Hemi Barracuda at the NHRA Nationals; those are memories I'll never forget!



The group with the Sox & Martin Display also featured a Double Overhead Cam Chrysler Hemi engine on a stand complete with postings of original design drawings. This engine was being developed as the next step in the NASCAR war with Ford but was shut down early when NASCAR banned the Hemi for competition in 1965. This was NASCAR's attempt to make the manufacturers only run vehicles and engines available to the general public. This was later proven to be a godsend to the Mopar faithful as Chrysler chose to release the Street Hemi as an option to anyone walking into a showroom in 1966. Without the ban, this likely may not have occurred and only a chosen few would have the delight of owning and driving one of these magnificent beasts!

Though the weather for the first March weekend show was brisk, the skies did cooperate on Friday and Saturday. Snow set in on Sunday afternoon so teardown began around noon as those traveling wished to miss slick, nasty roads. All told, it was another great show to break the winter blues until spring when our Mopar wheels start spinning again!

This month I have covered a couple of recent automobile related venues I attended. Both are worth seeing if you have the opportunity in the future. Now on to the next one.

REVS Institute, Naples Florida

As part of my wife Teresa, our friends and fellow IMC members Ron & Dru Kriech, and my annual pilgrimage to visit my brother Dan in Naples Florida, we visited a local automobile collection for the first time this year. I had heard of the REVS Institute Museum (2500 S. Horseshoe Drive, Naples FL 34104; phone 239-687-7387; website: revsinstitute.org) from enthusiast magazines and recently from a conversation with another 'car guy' at a restaurant in Indy. Hearing so much positive press, we decided to check it out while on vacation there.

As a note, the museum is only open a few days per week and has limited hours. You must purchase advanced tickets (on-line or by phone) for specific dates and timeslots. Appointments only, no 'walk-ins' per their website.

Interestingly, the museum collection is owned by a member of the Collier family. The patriarch of the family purchased much of the land this area of southern Florida in the 1920 before any development which was

obviously a very lucrative decision. Now the 3rd largest county in Florida, Collier County encompasses Naples, Marco Island and much of this southern area.

The museum did not disappoint. Their stated Mission is to deepen the "understanding and appreciation of automotive history". The collection is largely European exotics, though they did have a number of unusual American marque vehicles on display, including my main draw, a Chrysler Airflow coupe.





The extensive collection also had early to mid-50s Hemi powered Cunninghams, Cadillac racers including a prototype and of course the Ford GT 40s that dominated Lemans in the mid-60s. Hemi engine below.



The museum includes cars from 1896 to 1995, many that had a racing career in Europe, the US and even Cuba. The collection included those manufactured by Lotus, Ferrari, Maserati, Bentley, Fiat, Porsche, Mercedes, Abarth-Simca, Jaguar, Hispano Suiza. Bugatti, Stutz, Pierce-Arrow, Duesenberg, Packard, MG, Lancia, McLaren and so many more. The most visually spectacular was a 1937 Delahaye 135 Competition Special Roadster.

D. Westgate Show will be September 7 with rain date of September 14




