
Presidents Message

Bob Thomas Profile

It all started in 1964 while I was at Indiana Tech. My plan was to be an aerospace engineer and join NASA. I had ordered a '63 Impala SS with a 409 4 speed. Probably ordered too late because it never showed up. Finally, I went to Chicago where I ordered it. Bottom line, that jerk did not help. He then told me he couldn't refund my deposit. Well I was already ticked off as I slammed down on his desk. That woke him up as well as my friend who was with me on the trip. After various unprintable words, he produced a check. I went immediately to the bank and asked if the check was good. Finally, I got my money.

So now I was still driving a rust bucket '55 Ford. My friend finally convinced me to look at Plymouth or Dodge. His story was that his Dad had a '63 Fury with a Max Wedge. He said he needed posi-traction and enough Power to go to work in Gettysburg during the winter. He was fond of taking his friends for a ride and have dad downshift to second at 60 mph. Yeah, black marks and squirrely at full throttle.

So, I had a High School buddy working at the Dodge dealer. I bought my first Dodge with a 383 4-bbl, four speed. It became the fastest one in town. I was hooked. I raced it at an AHRA track northwest of Ft. Wayne. They still Flagged the start back then. I seemed to get a 2 car-length launch on any of the competition. I usually won each time I entered. I had run out of money for school and my friend and I started a speed shop in Ft. Wayne. By then I was really hooked.

We were towing his '63 Studebaker Lark race car to the track with the Dodge, usually not racing the Coronet. Some people were tired of trying to beat me. The reason for not racing it was a '63 Dodge called 'RUSS' DODGE'. One race a guy came over to look at my car. His comment was "You're in trouble today, Russ is here". This guy would hammer the opponent 2 to 2.5 lengths at the start and look in his mirror as he feather-footed it to the finish. I pulled to the staging lanes being cautious to avoid him until the finals in the class. When the flag dropped, we both came out together. He later told me that he looked in the mirror and did not see me. I remember seeing him panic and throwing hard shifts to try to beat me. He should have had an

easy go at it. He was running a 4.30: 1 rear end. Mine was 3.23:1 single track. He also had 10.5-inch slicks and mine were 7-inch.

Well he did beat me by ½ a front fender. Later, he came over to introduce himself. He said that was the closest race he had been in. I showed him what I had done to the car. He was surprised with my rear gear and small tires. I had a 750-cfm carb from a Pontiac and some cheap headers. Most gearheads at that time couldn't tell the difference. We got to be good friends and I helped him change the cam in his engine. Chrysler was sending him cams to try.

Later, at the track I was approached by a guy looking that was in that class. He told me they were protesting Russ, saying he had a 426 and not a 383. I told them that they were wrong and I had worked on his engine. Back then most bench racers, and Hot Rod magazine, couldn't tell a RB from a B block. I decided to enter the contest. Counting cars again I was paired with the buddy of the guy. He had a Fury. Piece of cake. Lining up again paired with the loud mouth, I asked if he saw what I did to his partner? Arrogantly, He scoffed and said, "Yeah I saw. But he has a big car and I got one like yours. And I have 10-inch slicks and a 4.10 gear. You don't." I beat him worse that I had his buddy.

One day in '66 we were returning to the shop, we passed a closed filling station. Sitting behind it was a '64 Dodge sedan. I checked and found that it was owned by an insurance company. I contacted them and they sent out an adjuster to show it to me. He said it was stolen and had no engine or trans. The car was an all steel Ramcharger 426 Max Wedge sedan. Later I discovered it was 1 of 25 built just before the Hemi replaced the Max Wedge. The car came from Mr. Norm's in Chicago. Should have kept it. While looking at the car I asked for the key to the trunk. The insurance guy was in front and he threw them to me. Opening the trunk to inspect, there was the cross-ram manifold and carbs, 4.56 rear end and transmission. The rear and the trans are in my Colt today. I quickly closed the trunk and told him 'sold'. (\$300)

I ran the car for 7 years including the 1969 NHRA Div. 3 Super Stock Circuit. Top class back then. Pro Stock started in 1970 after 3 broken engines I ran out of money. Parts were getting expensive. In 1973 I went to Air Force Officer's school and stopped racing. Working for GM I was often criticized for driving Chryslers.

Going back to '70, at the shop we were setting up a street hemi for a young man. He seemed to have money but not very wise. We tuned the engine and rebuilt the trans. Put in a trans kit from B&M including a reverse valve body. My partner and I repeatedly told him and demonstrated the new shift pattern. His response was 'I know, I know. I know how to drive', We dropped it.

The night before the first race, we were finishing up. Partner says, you know we need to test it before delivery. It was 2 am, no mufflers. We idled to a road outside of town. I took the first pass. The car pulled the wheels and was gone. Awesome. He made a similar pass back. Slowly we went back to the shop. About 10 minutes later a police car cruised by very slow and the passenger officer was wagging his finger at us. They knew where we lived.

Later in '84 a friend at GM offered a '77 Colt for free if I would make it a race car. I said yes and the rest was history. These are only a few stories during that time. No time here, maybe later.


New Business – Bob Thomas


