Dart & Donna's Odyssey (or as Donna calls it 'The Money Pit Experience')

Almost 2 years ago Donna decided it was no longer felt safe to ride our 2005 Honda Goldwing motorcycle due all the motorists she was observing texting and driving. We had ridden to California and back, to the Outer Banks on the east coast, the Dragon's Tail at Deal's Gap, and a lot of other fun destinations. So we sold our motorcycle.

So what to do and still have the experience of the open road. We decided to buy a convertible. I wanted a classic car that I can do normal maintenance on. On the internet I came across a 1967 Dodge Dart GT convertible in B5 blue with white interior and top that a classic car dealership had. It had the white bumble bee stripes on the back and Rallye wheels. The dealer said the previous owner had rebuilt it about 7 to 8 years ago. It was a beautiful looking car, and since it was a Dart and my first name is Dart - I wanted it. Dart would have a DART.





The car was located in Oklahoma and the pictures showed the body was in good shape and had a 273 Commando engine with an automatic transmission and power steering (Donna could drive it). Since the car was so far away we decided to hire an inspector to check it out. The dealership recommended an inspector that would be honest, so we hired the inspector. The inspector sent us a report with photos and a video of him driving the car, so everything seemed good. We bought the car and hired a transporter to haul it to our home.

The car arrived and it looked as good as the photos, yeah. Upon our first drive we noticed the engine did not run as well as I thought it should, a noise was coming from the rear end, and none of the dash gauges worked. None of these issues were mentioned in the inspector's report.

Looking over the engine I noticed it had a 2 barrel carburetor which is not correct for a 273 Commando engine, should have a 4 barrel. I checked the number on the carburetor and it indicated it came off of a 1950's era Desoto. We did not feel safe driving the car very far in the condition it was in. So we contacted Wedan Street & Performance located in Columbus, Indiana to evaluate and fix issues.

It turned out the rear end was in terrible shape. They had to replace everything inside it and could only keep the outside part of the axle. The original 2.73 gears were replaced with 3.55 gears. The gauges did not work because the circuit boards in the dash had cracked due to old age and had to be replaced. The cigarette lighter worked, but every time we plugged the GPS into it the fuse would blow. So a separate auxiliary plug-in was installed.

The steering was pretty sloppy. The steering unit was replaced with a Firm Feel unit, which cured the problem.

We could not lock the doors because the ignition key did not fit them, and there was not a key provided for the doors. The door locks had to be changed. The driver side window did not roll up and down very well, so had to have that fixed. Especially since it did not roll up level.

Donna did not like the manual brakes, plus it did not stop as quickly as her 2015 Subaru Forester. This was also due to having drum brakes in front and back. So we decided to invest in a power brake booster and disc brakes on the front. In turned out the 14 inch Rallye wheels would not fit the disc brake conversion so we had to upgrade to 15 inch Rallye wheels. Which meant we had to go from 5X4 inch bolt pattern to 5X4.5 inch bolt pattern, resulting in converting the bolt pattern on the rebuilt rear end.

Turns out the engine and 904 transmission also needed some TLC. So we could either have the engine and transmission in the car rebuilt, or have another engine and transmission put in.



Wedan Performance had a 318 with 4 barrel intake and carb that was taken out of a Mopar (the owner had a 340 installed) and another 904 transmission. So we decided to have the 318 and other 904 done the way we wanted. The 318 had an Edelbrock intake manifold and Edelbrock Performer 4 barrel 600 CFM carburetor.

The 318 was bored 30 thousands over. Inputted were hydraulic lifters, roller rocker arms, premium piston rings, double roller timing set, SBM cam bearing, Hi-Energy pushrods, and COMP XE262H cam. The radiator was cleaned and pressure tested. The 904 was rebuilt and in great shape. It turned out the kick down linkage on the 273 would not fit the 318 so we had to install a kick down cable. I decided to have Edelbrock aluminum heads installed. Unfortunately the stock exhaust manifolds will not fit these heads so we had to install Hedman Hedders. The car already had dual exhausts with an H pipe configuration. There was only about 1.5 inches of clearance between the driver Hedder and the road. So the torsion bars had to be adjusted to raise up the front end, and that resulted in having a realignment of the front.

We had noticed a crack forming close to the driver side shock in the engine compartment indicating body putty in that area. We were concerned about safety being so close to the shock absorber. When the engine and transmission were out of the car, the car was taken to a body shop and fixed.

With all the money invested, I did not like the oil pressure being monitored by an idiot light and was not comfortable with the dash mounted temperature gauge. Therefore installed under the dash an oil pressure gauge and temperature gauge.

The car came with only a driver's side view mirror - as was standard equipment back then. For safeties sake we had a matching passenger side view mirror installed. Apparently back in 1967 the two back seat belts were for a child or skinny adult (most were back then). I installed longer 60" seat belts and put one of the short ones in the middle so three persons could sit safely in the back.

The original radio was in the car but did it not work. The car had an aftermarket radio mounted under the driver's seat which was impossible to operate in that location, plus every time we hit a bump the radio would turn off. So we had a RetroSound Redondo radio installed in the dash (we kept the original radio). Now we can listen to music and control the radio.

We are now looking into installing KYB shocks in front and rear because the car rides a little boaty for my liking.

In the future (2-3 years): We want to install a new windshield since it has a lot of spider web type scratches. These are not a problem when driving during the day time, but is somewhat concerting when driving at night with the headlights of oncoming traffic. Install a new convertible top because there is a small tear. I repaired it with some heavy duty thread and FLEX SEAL. It worked great for a temporary fix. The Dart is a real beauty and a constant work in progress. It is lots of fun and looking forward to lots of


